MISSION



In addition, Key students are celebrated for demonstrating essential life skills including responsible decision making, maintaining strong relationships, being self-aware and socially aware, and emotional self-management.

EMPOWERING STUDENTS

Key Elementary hosts assemblies and programs throughout the year to help students visualize their academic future in the Memorial High School feeder pattern. This includes visits to Key from Memorial High School scholar-athletes, who provide encouragement and role-modeling for Key students. Other programs celebrate the heritage of different cultures, such as the Casa de la Cultura music program hosted during Hispanic Heritage Month. Every month, students are recognized individually as students of the month and as a class of the month, based on their demonstration of essential life skills such as responsibility. Students are also recognized for their attendance with weekly and monthly incentives.

STEM PROGRAMMING



ART ENRICHMENTS

As part of our enrichment programming at Key Elementary, we offer learning-infused field trips to locations such as The Gathering Place and JA Biztown. Through our specials classes, our teachers provide hands-on, engaging learning experiences. For example, in Physical Education, students compete in distance competitions (such as running or disc golf) and use mathematics to calculate the results. In Art, students engage in learning units such as print-making, sewing, fabrics, ceramics, and various types of drawing and painting. In Library, students explore multiple genres of literature and a wide variety of informational texts in a way that supports their critical thinking skills.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

Key Elementary provides targeted support for students who are learning English as a second language. Our goal is to provide them with the instruction and supports to make them comfortable learning to speak, listen, read, and write in English. Our approach is to value the heritage language skills that students bring with them to learning, capitalizing on the benefits of multilinguality to the students and to the community at large!
